EDUCATIONAL LEADER REPORT

New room programs have commenced in each learning environment.

Joey's inquiry is based around gross motor development with many of the children starting to walk and then extending into running and climbing in the outdoor environment.

Wallaby's inquiry is based around who I am and creating a sense of becoming. Children in this room and learning about their emotions and how to express them as well as how they fit within our world, who they are and what are their interests. Kangaroo's inquiry will be based around belonging to the community and the roles in which they play and the roles we see in the community (police, doctors, shops etc).
